## EMPLOYEE PROTOCOLS

### DAILY WELLNESS CHECKS



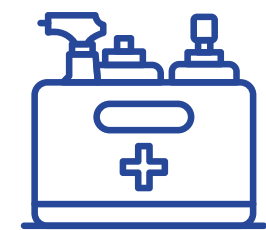
Every Museum employee and volunteer receives a daily wellness check to ensure they are healthy and symptom-free.

### MASKS

All Museum employees and volunteers will wear face masks.



### SANITIZING ALL HIGH-CONTACT AREAS



We clean and sanitize our high-touch areas using a sanitizer that has been validated by the government to be effective against COVID-19 and other viruses.

### HANDWASHING

All Museum team employees and volunteers are trained to wash their hands hourly and between tasks.



## WHAT WE ASK OF OUR VISITORS

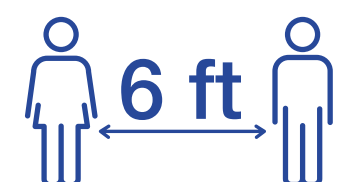
### MASKS



ALL Visitors to the Museum, must wear a face mask while visiting the Museum. **Entry into the Museum will be refused for those who do not wear masks.\***

\*The rule does not apply to children under 2 and those with medical conditions preventing the safe use of masks.

### PHYSICAL DISTANCING



Visitors are separated by 6 feet using line markers at exhibits throughout the Museum. Regular Museum announcements will be made reminding visitors to practice safe physical distancing.

### HANDWASHING

Visitors will be encouraged to wash their hands frequently.



### STAY HOME IF...

Remember, to stay home if you are feeling sick or have a sick family member in your home.

If you develop emergency warning signs for COVID-19, seek medical attention immediately. Emergency warning signs include\*:

- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
- New confusion or inability to arouse
- Bluish lips or face
